BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery County, Virginia that a transfer of appropriation is hereby authorized, as follows:

Said resolution transfers funds to cover outside legal services costs associated with the Mountain Valley Pipeline certification with FERC.

ISSUE/PURPOSE: Outside Legal Services.

JUSTIFICATION: The FY 2017 budget included \$22,898 in Special Contingencies to provide funding for potential environmental and research studies related to the Mountain Valley Pipeline project and the Radford Army Ammunition Plant. This portion of the funds will be used to retain legal services related to the Mountain Valley Pipeline project. After the transfer, \$7,898 will remain in Special Contingencies.

JUSTIFICATION: The State awarded the Commonwealth's Attorney a grant to fund staff associated with domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and family abuse services. The funds must be used to hire new staff or expand the number of hours worked by current staff. The grant does not require the County to continue supporting the additional staff after the grant funds are expended. No local match is required.

JUSTIFICATION: The State awarded this grant to the Commonwealth Attorney's office for the FY 17 Victim Witness program. The funds will be used for staffing and operational costs. The grant does not require the

County to continue supporting additional payroll costs after the grant funds are expended. No local match is required.

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Said resolution appropriates funds remaining from the FY 16 appropriation for the payments to the Western Virginia Regional Jail for capital projects for the County's Jail.

**ISSUE/PURPOSE:** Jail Capital Maintenance.

**JUSTIFICATION:** The County's share of the FY 16 Western Virginia Regional Jail was lower than budgeted as fewer County inmates were housed at the Regional Jail than anticipated. This resolution appropriates those remaining funds to help address capital projects needed at the County's local jail.

**1. SUBJECT: ADDITION TO THE SECONDARY SYSTEM OF STATE HIGHWAYS**

WHEREAS, The street(s) described on the attached Additions Form AM-4.3, fully incorporated herein by reference, are shown on a plat in the Clerk’s Office of the Circuit Court of Montgomery County; and

WHEREAS, The representative for the Virginia Department of Transportation has advised the Montgomery County Board of Supervisors that the street(s) meet the requirements established by the Virginia Department of Transportation’s Subdivision Street Requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors of the County of Montgomery, Virginia requests the Virginia Department of Transportation to add the street(s) described below to the secondary system of state highways, pursuant to Section 33.2-705, Code of Virginia and the Department’s Subdivision Street Requirements, after receiving a copy of this resolution and all outstanding fees and documents required of the developer:

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board guarantees a clear and unrestricted right-of-way of 50 feet, as described, and any necessary easements for cuts, fills, and drainage.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board guarantees the performance of the street(s) requested herein to become part of the Secondary System of State Highways for a period of one year from the date of acceptance of the referenced street(s) by VDOT into the Secondary System of State Highways. The Board will completely reimburse all costs incurred by VDOT, up to \$40,000.00, to repair any faults in the workmanship or materials of the referenced street(s) and related drainage facilities as determined exclusively by VDOT.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Residency Administrator for the Virginia Department of Transportation.

ISSUE/PURPOSE: To amend resolution adopted July 25, 2016.

JUSTIFICATION: VDOT has informed the County that Old Stage Road and Hogans Retreat within Hogans Retreat Subdivision are ready to be taken into the Secondary System of State Highways. At their July 25, 2016 the Board adopted a resolution to request VDOT to accept these roads into the Secondary System of State Highways. VDOT is requesting that the Board guarantee the performance of the road for one year and reimburse them for any costs up to \$40,000. This resolution amends the July 25, 2016 resolution to guarantee this request.

This is at no cost to the County. On October 26, 2015 the Board appropriated \$75,000 received from the developer of Hogans Retreat Subdivision as a line of credit for the County to bring the streets up to VDOT standards.

BE IT RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors of Montgomery County, Virginia hereby re-appoints **Mark Sisson, the Town of Christiansburg Police Chief**, to the **Transportation Safety Commission**, effective August 13, 2016 and expiring August 12, 2019.

ISSUE/PURPOSE: To re-appoint Blacksburg Police Chief Anthony Wilson and Christiansburg Police Chief Mark Sisson to the Transportation Safety Commission.

JUSTIFICATION: The Transportation Safety Commission is required by state statute to gather local input in recognizing and solving problems in the area of highway safety. Members represent local town governments, county government, the school system, State Police, DMV, VDoT, the MPO, and 2 citizen members. The citizen appointments are advertised. Established in 1975-County Code §2-13 Administration – Sec. 2-11 Highway Safety Commission.
